

From the Chairman

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT to Annual General Meeting 2023

We are pleased to report that the use of all three hails has continued to increase and we have welcomed a number of new regular users as well as our long standing affiliates.

We continue to maintain the halls to the highest standard and replace or repair as necessary. In order to further improve the removal of rainwater from roofs we have replaced the guttering around the main hall sloping roofs with large capacity gutters. These drain directly into the surface water drains and reduce the water on the flat surfaces which have caused us problems in the past.



Our 5 yearly electrical inspection has been carried out and the final non-led lights have been replaced to reduce our energy usage.

In the Harrison Room toilets, and following a request from users, assistance bars were fitted and this has caused us to revisit the plans to reburbish those cloakrooms. Without a major external extension we do not have room for a full disabled toilet but we are revising the plans with a view to providing 'ambulatory' toilets in both the Ladies and Gents. These would provide more space and assistance for users with mobility problems. Unfortunately we were not successful with our grant application to the Asda Foundation, although we reached the final shortlist. We are reapplying to other grant bodies for this year.

Our Village Day theme was 'On Safari' and we were lucky to have really good weather. Very large crowds turned up to enjoy the parade of local youngsters as well as the music, entertainment and stalls. Many thanks to more than 50 of our affiliated organisations who ran stalls, refreshments and provided volunteers.

With help from our sponsors we raised over £14,000, a record. Village Week following raised £6768 from Open Gardens, Quiz Night, the Afternoon Bridge Club and Mole Valley Silver Band. Thank you to all who made that possible.

My thanks go to our staff, Halls Manager Roger Musgrove and Assistant Manager, Rob Williams for all their work over the year. None of this would have been possible without the volunteers on our Management and Village Day Committees and also Bookham Open Gardens Committee who do so much work behind the scenes. Thank you all.

We also wish to acknowledge the outstanding work of our ex-Membership Secretary, Dolf Arnold, who has stepped down from his role and the committee after many years. Dolf built up our Membership Donations to a substantial figure with his network of collectors as well as bringing technical expertise to the Committee.

New team and position in Trust set to make Great Bookham an education destination

Great Bookham School, formerly The Dawnay, is experiencing an injection of new talent and investment through its

place as part of the South Farnham Educational Trust. Delivering the same outstanding curriculum as all the schools in the Trust, with fantastic grounds and potential for growth, Great Bookham is already benefitting from the Trust's focussed support.

A key part of that mission is the appointment of Head Teacher, Miss Jenna Allen. During her 14 years within primary education, she has taught across the entire primary phase and has a wealth of experience in driving school improvement through a variety of senior leadership roles.

Already the school has seen in the introduction of £120,000 worth of IT equipment and IT infrastructure which is having an immediate positive and direct impact on the children. Children now have access to class sets of iPads and laptops which can be used in class in all subject areas. In addition, all children's toilets are to be fully refurbished this academic year, the start of a range of indoor school environment improvement plans.

But there is much more to come! With the additional guidance of Mrs Fiona O'Neill as Executive Head Teacher of both The Raleigh and Great Bookham, the school is making strides towards its goal of becoming an educational destination in the eyes of local parents and children alike.

Miss Allen says: "I understand there have been some significant changes of leadership over the last four years, within the school. However, myself and South Farnham Educational Trust, are fully committed to ensuring that there is continued leadership stability."

At Polesden Lacey Infant School we have six values: being fair, resilient, respectful, caring, courageous and curious. In this edition of the Bookhams Bulletin I would like to focus on curiosity and what it means to the children. To help me do this I asked the children, in an assembly, some of the ways that they were curious and they did not disappoint with their answers! All of their suggestions were about knowing more, understanding more and being amazed at what they were finding out.

In this age where so many of us will 'Google it' to find an answer, the children had many more creative ways to feed their curiosity. They suggested, 'watching what others are doing', 'asking questions', 'having conversations', 'exploring', 'looking, smelling, touching, tasting and listening', 'thinking' and 'finding challenges to stretch our brains'.

Working in a school, particularly an infant school like Polesden Lacey Infant School, where the children have so many opportunities, both in the classroom and in our wonderful outdoor spaces to explore and observe, we see many moments of awe and wonder.

Within the space of one week children marvelled at; watching an open fire burn and seeing what happens when different substances are entered into the flames; finding an empty bird's egg and working out what type of bird laid the egg; spotting a slow worm and discovering more about it and making charcoal pencils from sticks found in the woods.

Year 2 children also fed their curiosity about the explorers who had visited places on our planet and on the moon, which led them to ask questions about our solar system and the universe. Year 1 have been learning about the Amazon Rainforest and the threats to it. It led them to be curious about the impact on all the animals that live there and what they could do to help reverse the destruction. It is such a privilege to nurture our children's curiosity and



as Albert Einstein said, 'the important thing is not to stop questioning; curiosity has its own reason for existing'.

Enjoy being curious!

On Thursday 12 October The Howard held an Open Evening for students to find out a bit more what life in the Sixth Form is like. Celebrating Success at The Howard

We celebrated our success over the summer with our KS4 and KS5 results, with students achieving what they needed to go on and be successful in the next stage of their careers: whether this be Howard 6th Form, a 6th Form College, an apprenticeship, a university course, or a first job.

Outcomes were improved on 2019 (the only relevant comparison given the variability of the Covid years) at both KS4 and KS5, and remained well above Surrey and national averages. At KS5, we achieved 30% A*/A (compared to a national average of 27%) and



80% A*-C (compared to a national average of 76%). At KS4, we achieved 37% 9-7 (compared with 23% nationally) and 73% 9-5 (compared with 55% nationally).

Impressively the percentage of students achieving 9-5 in English and Maths (65%) increased by 12% on our 2019 results, and is also 12% higher than the Surrey average. These excellent results are testament to the partnership between students, staff, and parents/carers which is so strong at The Howard, and which we know will continue this academic year.








We are also beautifying eyesores such as the substation at Lower Shott, the verge by the traffic lights and in front of the telephone exchange in Church Street. We were



delighted to be finalists in the Surrey Wildlife Trust Community Champions Award.

We appreciate that not everyone is a fan of our project and we are trying hard to maintain a balance to keep everybody happy. There were teething problems when the new mowing contractors didn't mow a lot of places that they should have mown! Thankfully this now seems to have been resolved.

Polesden Lacey Playschool





were very pleased to BOOKHAM have a stand at the Green Fair held at St

Nicolas in mid-September. Many thanks to the Eco teams at St Nicolas Church and Bookham Baptist Church for organising it and inviting us

In September we also attended an evening at Leatherhead Theatre organised by Surrey Climate Commission entitled 'What's stopping us stopping climate change?'. The speakers were Lord Deben, former chair of the UK Climate Committee, Natalie Bennett, former leader of the Green Party, and systems thinking expert Ed Straw. It was an interesting evening with the three speakers offering different perspectives on the question posed. Solutions ranged from the need for major changes to our

political system to changes in our individual choices and behaviour, but all were in agreement that we need to act now.

On that note, another positive step has been taken in the reduction of single-use plastic with a ban on certain items including plastic cutlery and polystyrene cups that came into force at the beginning of October.

Another piece of good news is that Bookham and Horsley Rotary and St Mary's Church in Fetcham are working together to start up a local repair cafe. At the time of writing we were looking forward to attending an open meeting to find out more.

We also need more smallmedium local businesses to sign up as Business Champions to promote the process of reducing avoidable single-use plastic - see the Plastic Free Communities website plasticfree.org.uk for further details. Coot & Moorhen

Anywhere there is quiet water, there are Rails, dark birds with a distinctive shape and gait. Their bodies are slim to slide through reeds or grasses; the legs, feet and toes relatively long to aid progress running over land, floating vegetation and mud. Only two species are easy to see, swimming on open water and feeding on grassy banks - the Coot and the Moorhen. Nests can be obvious as both species build bulky structures, platforms of vegetation close to or in shallow water. Both



birds are easily found on Bookham Commons.

The Moorhen is black with white flashes along its sides and shows a white tail as it runs away - as it frequently does! Adults have a red frontal shield with a yellow tip, while young birds have black bills. An omnivore, the moorhen eats leaves, worms and insects. It rarely dives, feeding on surface insects and leaves when swimming, or walking on mud or grass and even climbing into shrubs in search

The Coot is black with a prominent white head shield, origin of the phrase "bald as a coot". Mainly vegetarian, it feeds on land, on floating vegetation and in water. It may surface feed, scrape algae off with its head just submerged or dive to reach water plants on the bottom. Its long legs enable it to sprint when required and its toes have distinctive lobes to assist swimming and diving. It brings any weed collected on dives to the surface before eating, so is sometimes robbed by aggressive ducks.



Coots can be extremely aggressive to each other as well, having spectacular fights over territory. They feed their fluffy red-billed chicks for a month, longer than most water
