





#### Let us play!



currently the range is eight to well over the M25 speed limit!





It was the first time some had ever played and they all thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

We competed in the football tournament at Downsend School against various teams. We made it to the quarter-finals and then reached the 'semis' with an overall 3rd place!

We looked very smart in our new kit! There was a selection of field and track events, including a 6-lap relay, obstacle relay, javelin and standing triple jump. Out of the seven schools, we came 4th! Our favourite events were the javelin (we came 1st), the standing triple jump and the relay races. Thanks to the staff for supporting us in this amazing event. We had a great time!"

And for those who prefer music we have a packed diary for them next term which we will be keen to share with you next time!

## **Rainbow Pre School**



Our preschool has had another busy and fun filled term with the children. Alongside our work during the pre-

school session, staff have been having additional training to help further support children's learning and language development. 'Shared, Sustained Thinking' is a way of communicating and interacting with children which helps reinforce and extend their language and learning through play. It requires the adult to follow the child's lead during an activity and immerse themselves in the child's world in the present moment. "Adult's enter children's play by being silent, observing, understanding and listening (SOUL). This enables the adult to 'tune in' to what is going on'. Interaction then between the adult and child, is focussed on the child's train of thought, and language is used to

extend a child's ideas thought process and language. This method is adapted according to that child's stage of development. This training also encourages children to refer to one another for help and share ideas, with the adult encouraging and prompting if needed. This helps aid confidence and social development. We are using this training throughout the session and it is now an integral part of the way our staff interact with the children.

In addition to this, staff and children are learning and using Makaton daily. Makaton is a form of sign language used with key words WITH the spoken language. This can help enable a child to communicate with adults and peers when they have verbal language difficulties and/or delay. It can also encourage understanding of the spoken language. Every two weeks staff are choosing a couple of words/signs which are



then used regularly with all the children during sessions in Rainbow, this helps promote a more natural and consistent use of signing for children and staff.

Bookham Baptist Children's Centre launched in January 2016 following the closure of the previous SureStart Wellspring Children's Centre, shut after government budget cuts. We could see that our local community really needed and benefitted from having a safe and welcoming place where all families can access support, information and fun activities with their little ones.

Since the start we have run a range of groups such as Rhyme Time, Noah's Ark and Walkie Talkies. More recently we run weekly Bumps and Babies and Crawlers and Cruisers groups, so we are regularly in touch with around 40 families a week. If you have a little one, or are a grandparent or carer looking after a child under 5, then do come along, we would love to meet you  $\boxtimes$ 

Life isn't always easy and parenting can at times be really challenging. We all need a little bit of extra support to help us through the tricky times. We have provided much needed Family Support and outreach to 70 families in the last 5 years. Family Support has been a bit

of a lifeline for families throughout the pandemic.

The centre is funded by charitable giving from people in the church and local community and via grants. We have recently lost £10,000 per year of grants. To keep the groups going and to continue the Family Support work we need to raise £10,000 per year.

#### **Freestyle**

During the Easter Holidays LYP took 29 young people away for a residential break to Walton Firs Activity

Centre in Cobham. The four-day trip was a fantastic opportunity for the young people to enjoy time together, while encouraging them to venture outside of their comfort zone with activities including archery, air rifle shooting, high and low ropes and climbing.

Each evening the group would come together for dinner, followed by a talk and discussion on topics such as facing your fears and perseverance.

Residentials are a great way to build solid relationships with the young people and get to know their needs, so that we can best support them during our other projects.

#### **Life After AllSaints**

The former AllSaints Coffee Shop Manager, Laura Dicken has joined Leatherhead Youth Project as Project Development Lead. Laura's focus is to create a new offering for older young people who are struggling to access education or employment. We are currently researching the needs of this cohort through interviews and school surveys. Working closely with a small group of older young people known to LYP we are now in the pilot stage, trialling different offerings that will best support their needs.

#### **BYouth Bookham Youth Work**

BYouth is LYP's youth café in Bookham. It's open twice a week after school for young people in school years 7 – 11. The aim of BYouth is to provide a safe, positive space for

young people to meet friends, enjoy activities and games, and get to know our youth workers. BYouth allows our team to build positive relationships with local young people, and by doing so we can understand their needs and support them in other areas of their lives. Our team can help with referrals to counselling, careers advice and support with learning specific skills.

BYouth is open Monday and Friday, 4:15 – 6:15pm. We have games consoles, table football and toasties. BYouth currently meets at St. Nicolas Pastoral Centre which can be accessed by taking the alleyway between HeadsUp and Carolinas on Church Road, Bookham.

We've always been an environmentally aware setting, working on reducing our single use plastics, reusing uniform with second hand sales and recycling regularly with TerraCycle (saving an incredible 30kg of non recyclable plastic waste from landfill so far). We've also been working closely with Plastic Free Bookham to become community allies and are now officially signed up to Plastic Free Nurseries.

Plastic Free Nurseries is part of the Plastic Free Schools programme from Surfers Against

Sewage. The programme has been developed to tackle unnecessary single use plastics in communities. There are stories, activities and actions within the programme which will raise awareness of the plastic problem and take positive steps to reduce the amount of single use plastic used in our playschool.

There are five objectives for us to complete. These objectives work alongside the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework helping children's personal, social and emotional development, understanding of the world around them and expressing themselves through art and design with a positive environmental message at its core.

Motivated and powering through our first objective, we have set up our Plastic Free Nurseries Club, welcome to all Playschool staff, parents and pupils to join. Plastic pollution is a huge problem and an unwelcome sight at every beach, park and river across our planet.

If we work together, we can stop plastic pollution from taking over our world. Let's start now in our playschool!
